



Children's Program Kit Training

The Children's Program Kit was created through a collaboration of SAMHSA and NACoA (National Association for Children of Alcoholics). The kit is a tool for treatment providers and other helping professionals to utilize when working with children of addicted parents, in an effort to provide them with age-appropriate education about addiction, assist them in the identification and healthy expression of emotions, and to empower them with new coping skills.

The Texas Alliance for Drug Endangered Children (TADEC) feels very strongly that all children removed from volatile drug environments must receive support services to address their psychosocial needs.
